

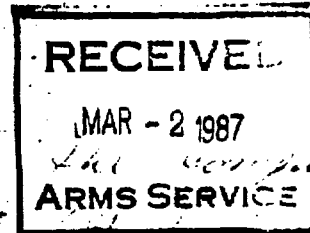

Gentlemen, I have a Rem. Mod. 600-308
Ser. No. 75093 and I wish to trade it.

I've had some frightening ex-
perience with it over the years.
I've learned not to leave a
Cartridge Chamber because it is liable
to fire at any time. Sometimes when
I take it out of the gun cabinet
it is cocked. Once it was leaning
against a tree while on a deer hunt.
Several of us were drinking coffee,
no one within 20 ft. and it
suddenly fired. Sometimes, after setting
in a deer stand for hours I finally
give up and start to unload, and
as soon as I push the safety
off, it fires. There is no way to be
any more careful with it than I am.
I bought it because of the compact
size, now I'm trading it for a model
Seven in 7mm-08. That is I tried
to trade it. No one wants to take
