Item 5 -- With the above background on record, I then took the rifle to a local gunsmith to ask him to see if he could identify the problem and fix it. He advised me to forward the rifle back to you for your action.

Item 6 -- I thereby attach as part of this letter the referenced rifle and scope. You will notice that the bolt works very stiffly. This happened after the second accidental discharge. I was again ejecting the shells by using the bolt and at one point it became stuck and I had to use great force to get it open. I used the rifle for another day without incident and the rifle is now in your hands in the condition as of my last day of hunting - December 1, 1982.
