## Gentlemen:

Examination has been completed on the Model 700 BDL L.H. 270 Win. caliber rifle, serial number B6775404, that you returned to us a short time ago because "the gun enclosed will fire sometimes when the safety is thrown."

The returned firearm, which was produced in March of 1986, has been thoroughly examined and found to contain our high-pressure proof test, gallery test, and final inspection stampings, indicating that it had successfully passed all necessary tests and inspections before being shipped from our factory.

The general condition of the gun appeared to be very good. In going over the individual parts, we found the headspace, recoil shoulders and chamber all to be normal.

Our initial testing and functioning of the rifle, in its asreceived condition, revealed that the trigger had no retraction
spring action to properly position it on cocking. Sometimes the
rifle would not cock when the bolt was closed; the firing pin would
simply follow down on the bolt cocking cam. Subsequent disassembly
of the rifle disclosed that the trigger pull adjustment screw had
been backed-out to the point where no spring force was left. Trigger pull was measured to be 2-1/4 pounds, well below our minimum
specification of 3-1/2 pounds. In future use, we strongly advise
that the trigger not be adjusted by untrained non-Remington personnel.
