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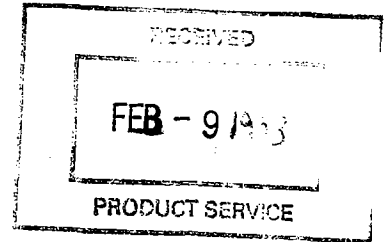

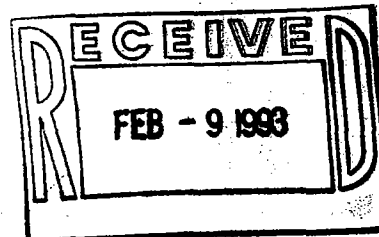

Thank you in advance for your prompt response and your assistance in this matter.

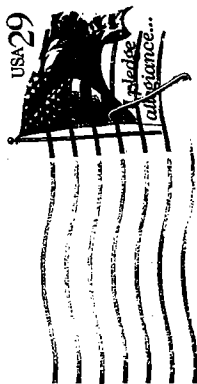
