Dear Mr. Doran:

This letter is in supplement to our phone conversation of January 13, 1995 and receipt of your Model Seven rifle on February 6, 1995.

We were indeed sorry to learn of the mishap which injured Mr. Zammerilla.

Upon examining your rifle, we did note the following:

~~Rifle condition very good, it was manufactured in September of 1993~~ R.F. was manufactured in September of 1993

- It has been recently heavily lubricated, the lubrication is dripping from the receiver
- The trigger adjustment and stop screws have had the sealant removed.
- We could not duplicate the concern of the rifle — <sup>you described</sup> discharging when the safety was pushed to fire position.
- Rust was found inside the trigger housing assembly, on the base of the trigger, under the safety detent spring and around the trigger pin.

Mr. Doran, during our phone conversation of January 13, 1995, you stated that the rifle malfunctioned because it had gotten wet and rusted. You also mentioned about all the rain you recently had in the Ft. Myers area.

A rust condition could cause the internal components of the trigger assembly to size-up or not function as designed.
