RE: Sharon Gregory

Sharon Gregory is a lady whom I have been seeing since 12 November 2000. She had a gunshot wound to the left foot. This involved partial removal of the neck of her talus and it also entered the ankle joint itself. She also damaged her dorsal pedal artery going to the left foot at the same time. She's had multiple operations on this for debridement and at this point has healed over most of her wounds. She continues to occasionally express metal fragments as well as portions of what I believe to be the sock that she was wearing at the time of the gunshot wound.

Long term sequela of this would include a fair amount of stiffness and decreased range of motion of the left ankle as well as pain in the hindfoot and midfoot areas of the left foot. She is able to ambulate but only for short distances and I would suspect that this will continue to be a problem permanently. It would also affect her ability to stand for long periods of time.
