Confirming our telephone conversation of 1/18/95, let me explain my predicament.

My son and I operate a Duck/Goose Hunting Guide Service in Virginia. We hunt virtually every day of the season. We purchased two SP-10 Magnum Autoloading shotguns prior to this season.

Our experience with the SP-10's up until now was extremely positive - no equipment malfunctions and terrific stopping power on ducks and geese. However, on Monday, January 16, 1995 the problems started. While rising to stand for a shot in the duck blind, my gun - serial No. RM 014927 bumped against the front of the blind and fired. Fortunately, I was on the left side of the blind and other incident occurred.

On 1/18/94 while sitting in a goose blind, I moved the same gun from one slot to another. When the butt end touched the floor, the gun fired and blew a corner off of the blind. It about scared me to death. Both times the safety was "on."

Jack, I don't abuse my guns, but I don't baby them either. I require 100% safety performance. I will never shoot this gun again! I would like either a replacement gun or a refund.
