

Shooting School Opens

REMINGTON RELOCATES CORPORATE OFFICES

Remington Arms will relocate its headquarters to Rockingham County, North Carolina in mid-1996.

The company announced that it would bring approximately 60 employees to the new site from Wilmington, Delaware, the current home office location. The new headquarters facility will employ nearly 150 people, with approximately 90 administrative, clerical, managerial, and professional positions being recruited from the local community in North Carolina.

"A combination of factors made North Carolina an especially attractive place to establish a new world headquarters—one that will help poise Remington for an even brighter future," said Thomas L. Millner, Remington's President and Chief Operating Officer. "The quality of the local work force, the pro-business environment, and an aggressive package of economic incentives helped us make this very important business decision."

Remington already has a presence in nearby Greensboro, where the company's Law Enforcement and Government Sales office is located. "We know that Greensboro is a great place to live and work, that it is strategically located to facilitate travel to our key customers, and that the state is in the middle of a sporting paradise—the kind of hunting, fishing and outdoor activities that characterize

what we know as 'Remington Country'," said Millner.

Several potential sites are being considered in Rockingham County for the new Remington offices, which the company hopes to move into during the summer of 1996.

In addition to its current headquarters and Greensboro sales office, Remington also operates several other locations, including firearms manufacturing in Ilion, New York; ammunition manufacturing in Lonoke, Arkansas; clay target production in Findlay, Ohio and Ada, Oklahoma; a sales office in Bentonville, Arkansas; and a research and development center in Elizabethtown, Kentucky.

The company also markets fishing lines and accessories under the Stren® brand name. Remington employs nearly 3,000 people worldwide.



REMINGTON SHOOTING SCHOOL ESTABLISHED

Remington has opened a new shooting school conducted in Ilion, New York, the birthplace of the country's firearms industry.

The School holds 2½ day courses at the Ilion Fish & Game Club, near the

Remington Firearms Manufacturing Plant in Ilion, NY. The curriculum is designed to help students improve their shotgunning skills, with individualized instruction to help new shooters get started correctly, intermediate students improve, and advanced shooters to hone their abilities.

The Shooting School includes overviews on shooting safety, various shotgun designs, firearms maintenance, techniques of shooting /clay targets, and the mental and physical aspects of target shooting.

All instructors are certified by the National Sporting Clays Association. The curriculum was designed with the assistance of Robert Edwards, Chief Shotgunning Instructor of Sporting Clays Magazine, and Robert Wilson, Shotgun Program Manager of the National Rifle Association.

A number of specialty courses are planned each year, with some of the world's best shooters lending their assistance to the program, including Dan Bonillas, Wayne Mayes, and John Kruger, who will lead classes dedicated to trap, skeet and sporting clays.

As America's oldest continuing firearms manufacturer, Remington's first guns, naturally, were loaded from the muzzle. Though reminiscent of that earlier time, these new products comprise the latest, state-of-the-art developments in

design, quality, and materials of construction for black powder shooting.

As the foundation of the line, there will

be two modern in-line muzzleloading rifles built on the action of the strongest, most successful bolt action rifle ever made – Remington's famous Model 700™.

Remington's Black Powder Ammunition components set new standards of manufacturing quality, materials of construction and performance for muzzleloader shooting. They will include a complete line of sabot-encased, high performance jacketed hollow points; solid and hollow point lead conical bullets; a complete line of round balls, and of course, Remington's dependable No. 10 and No. 11 percussion caps.

Remington's Muzzleloading Accessories begin with a black powder starter kit, and include a complete line of premium loading, shooting, cleaning and maintenance items for traditional, percussion, and in-line black powder guns.

MUZZLELOADING RIFLES BUILT ON MODEL 700™ ACTIONS

In a unique combination of the past and the present, Remington is introducing two in-line muzzleloading rifles based on Model 700™ actions. The impli-

For black powder fanciers, the result is two, state-of-the-art in-line muzzleloaders -- the first ever built on a wellknown, totally proven modern action. Shooters will have the option of choosing from two versions: the Model 700™ ML with a carbon steel barreled action in .50 caliber, and the Model 700™ MLS, with barrel, receiver and bolt made of 416 stainless steel, and available in .50 and .54 calibers. Each will be set in a fiberglass-reinforced synthetic stock fitted with a Magnum-type rubber recoil pad. A solid aluminum ram rod is recessed into the fore-end, with a barrel band securing the rod's outer end.

Both these rifles have the same look, feel, balance and shape of a standard, short action Model 700°. Equally, both have the same bolt stroke and cocking motion as a standard Model 700°. The difference exists in a modified bolt and ignition system, and the fact that they are

loaded from the muzzle instead of the breech.

In these Black Powder versions of the Model 700°, the breech is closed off by a stainless steel plug and nipple. In the modified bolt, the normal firing pin striking mechanism is replaced with a large diameter cylindrical pin that is cocked much the same way as a centerfire firing pin, and released by the trigger pull to strike a No. 11 percussion cap. ammunition than any [Core-Lokt* Bullets and Sabots] other manufacturer. Designed specifically for black powder use, Remington muzzleloading sabots feature a stepped diameter that facilitates easier, faster insertion, and an integral locking lug that prevents sabot/bullet separation during handling.

In addition, Remington's black powder sabot assemblies utilize the best performing handgun bullet ever adapted to muzzleloader hunting - Remington's exclusive High Performance Jacket hollow point Core-Lokt® bullet. Core-Lokt® bullets are built with Remington's exclusive spiral nose cut design that provides a

highly effective combination of expansion, penetration and weight retention at the lower velocity levels of muzzleloaders. These new sabot-encased bullets will be available in .45, .50 and .54 caliber, with bullet weights ranging from 165 to 303 grains.





In 1996, Remington has taken the concept of its Model 700™ Sendero two steps further — creating a new, optional choice for hunters called the Model 700™ Sendero Stainless Fluted. This new version retains all the basic features of the standard Sendero, and adds two more — a stainless steel barrel, receiver and bolt, and a 26″ barrel with six longitudinal flutes. The fluted design dramatically improves the heat-dissipating characteristics of the barrel, while actually reducing its weight by a half pound. Overall rifle weight is now 8½ pounds.

The barreled action is set in Remington's varmint-style, synthetic

stock of fiberglass and graphite, reinforced with strong, stable, DuPont Kevlar^e. Integral with the stock is a full-length alu-

In 1996, Remington will offer factory-installed muzzle brakes on four Magnum-caliber chamberings of its Model 700™ BDL Stainless Synthetic rifles with detachable magazines. These rifles have been designated as the Model 700™

with symmetrical, pressure-relieving holes that is flush-fitted to the barrel.

Heavier magnum calibers are often the best or only answer to the need for the flatter trajectories, higher downrange velocities, and retained energy levels appropriate for hunting larger big game species. However, they also exact a penalty in greater recoil.

For years, the addition of muzzle brakes to reduce the punishing kick from big bore magnum cartridges was available only as a custom, add-on option.
