  Limited Edition, custom, etc.
- Research complete a third prototype incorporating added design features
- Testing of design be started

A M/7 bolt action rifle with these features could be introduced in 1984:

- Stock (new)
- Receiver -octagonal (outside new)
- Light firing pin (new)
- Hammer forge barrel smooth (new)
- Heavy barrel lug (new)
- Long action only (calibers)
- New bolt handle (new)
- No bind follower 83 guns

- M/700 Guard and floor plate
- Fire control (blocked trigger and sear) (new)
- Safety same as present
- Scope ring (new)
- Bolt lock on bolt plug
