Today I loaded a single shell into my model 700BDL(I never load more than that for safety
reasons)set the safety to safe position, and stood watch where varmint activity had been
occuring. After some while I elected to stop and entered the house. I aimed the gun away
from any persons and unlatched the safety. When I attempted to eject the shell by
activating the bold, the weapon discharged - in spite of having my fingers well away from
the trigger or trigger guard. I own many dozens of firearms and have been shooting for

over 45 years. This is the first time any firearm has unexpectedly fired. Condiderable damage was done to the interior of my house, and moreover, both my wife and I were in a close environment, and both of us are suffering ringing of the ears now.

My opinion is that this firearm is defective in design. I keep all my firearms clean, properly lubricated, and report any problems to a competent gunsmith. I had no reason to believe this arm was in any condition less than perfect.

I am now very concerned with my firearm, and other Remingtons I own. Please advise what action I need to take to a) get my firearm in safe operating condition, b) get re-imbursed for the damage to my home, and c) have a hearing test for both my with and me.
