If you purchase a used gun we would advise you to have the gun thoroughly examined by a qualified gunsmith. Should you purchase the gun and want to have Remington examine the gun we will be happy to do so at either a factory in Ilion, NY or one of our many Remington Authorized Repair Centers. Whether or not there would be any charge to you for any repairs made by us would be dependent on the nature and cause of the problem.
