Or follow these guidelines if in the US:

1. Record the serial number of your firearm before sending it to us.
2. Pack your firearm for safety and to prevent further damage in shipping and handling. Preferably, ship in a firearm box, not a hardcase.
3. Remove all accessories from your firearm to prevent loss or damage. This would include scope, slings, or extra choke tubes.
4. Enclose a letter with the firearm detailing the model name or number of your firearm and serial number along with a full description of the problem. Be sure to include your full name and address (P.O. Box and Street Address), including zip code, daytime telephone number, and e-mail address.
5. Ship your firearm by either United Parcel Service (UPS) or Parcel Post (US Post Office). Remington is not responsible for damage or loss during shipment, so you may elect to purchase insurance from your carrier. Customer is responsible for shipping charges to the factory.

Apparently there was a 1979 recall on the Remington Mohawk 600. Last month while deer hunting, my brother's 600 discharged when the lever was flipped off of safe. Fortunately the gun was pointing in a safe direction. He did some checking and discovered the rifle had been recalled. His rifle is the one that went off, but according to the recall it shouldn't have, it has the QUOTE in front of the serial number. Mine does not have the QUOTE. Neither rifle has a QUOTE on the trigger and neither one will allow bolt action to remove round from chamber. He checked with a local repair, sounded like they were reluctant to work on it, thought maybe the recall had expired. I have also

checked with one of your regional repair shops with the same results. Neither one of us are the original owners of the guns, wouldn't think that would matter on a safety issue. Is the recall still in effect and if it is where is the best place to get them repaired??
