The Operations Comittee, Arns DIVision, recommends to the Management the dropping from the line on January 1, 1959 of the Model 11-46R.

Sincetit is not hew planned to bring these smaller gauges out intefther of these guns, the Model 11-48 should be retained at lesstrfor the calendar year 1959. It was suggested that tinissubject be reveteded in approximately May 1959 to detembine plans tor 1960. ves

The tentative program called for deletion of all specQricationspf Sportsman-48 on January 1, 1959 except the 12 and 20 geage sidwhich were to be retained to January 1, 1960. The decision on whether to proceed with this program must await deision on introduction of the Sportsman-58A or the XS-3. If gne of these guns is introduced, the Committee will almost certeinly feel that the Sportsmar. 48 should be deleted as planned. If they are not introduced, we should probably retain the Sporta-man-48A for another year.

The question of parts coverage raised at the last meeting wili not assume importance until a decision is reeched to drop this inne.
