## BROWNING REPORT

## SHOTGUNS

#### MODEL 1100 AUTOLOADING SHOTGUN

#### Project Status

Production reported the Model 1100 is on schedule and pilot assembly will begin in early November. This will be done through by-passing and temporary operations, possibly to a larger extent than on any previous model. The temporary measures are required to prevent delay from equipment deliveries, and design and tooling changes. They will limit volume until February or March when permanent operations will be available.

Production contrasted the 15,000 initial quantity of Model II-8's with the much lesser quantity of Model II00's. Sales stated an initial warehouse quantity of 25% of the first years forecast is desirable, but lacking it is not as serious as when the Model II-8 was introduced. The trade now buys a smaller proportion of the year's sales during the first few months.

The Production Department is planning a combination finished and parts on hand inventory of 1,000 to 3,000 12 gauge Sportsman 58 when its production is discontinued. The actual quantity will be lowered as the Model 1100 becomes firmer.

The Sales Department agreed with this plan, and stated their goal is to sell only Model 1100 and Model 11-48 12 gauge autologders in 1963. They will not announce the Model 58 is being dropped, but will carry it "Subject To Stock On Hand".
