

CENTER FIRE RIFLES - contd.MODEL 700, CALIBER 22-250 REMINGTON

Management has approved the addition of the 22-250 Remington, 50 grain SP cartridge to the ammunition line. It has been proposed that the new caliber be included in the Model 700, ADL and BDL grades. The anticipated additional sales are nine hundred (900) ADL and four hundred (400) BDL for a total of thirteen hundred (1300) guns. The economics (Table 2) based on the present Model 700 selling price indicate a 45.1% return on total investment.

R & D is processing Barrels for the assembly and testing of a model gun to be available for approval at the October Operations Committee Meeting.

The caliber designation is 22-250 Remington for gun marking.

Winchester recently announced a 225 Winchester. Sales indicated that the Remington 22-250 must out-perform the Winchester cartridge. The discussion included the possible change from a 50 grain to 55 grain bullet. R & D development tests should indicate the best bullet weight for this new cartridge.

Committee Action

The committee approved and recommends General Management approve the addition of the Model 700, ADL and BDL, 22-250 Remington caliber to the line.
