

CENTER FIRE RIFLES - contd.MODEL 600 AND 700 BOLT ACTION RIFLESForeign Sales

Australian import requirements are for a shrouded Firing Pin Assembly. Sales stated that with the shroud, the marking of "S" and "F" on the Receiver would not be required. An additional 500 Australian export orders could be realized.

The plant indicated an additional \$.90 to \$1.00 factory cost to provide special Firing Pin Assemblies for export orders. There would also be a tooling cost of approximately \$2200. Warehousing of rifles could start in March.

Sales indicated that the need for the shroud could extend to other foreign countries.

Committee Action

The Ilion plant is to develop costs including tooling expenditures. An increase in the selling price for export rifles is to be established to cover the added costs.

The Ilion plant is to establish the design and proceed with tooling and component fabrication.

Barreled Actions (Tested Rifle Actions Without Stocks)

Sales proposed to Management October 19, 1964, the offering of Model 600 and 700 Barreled Actions to gunsmiths and Stock makers. The announcement would be made at the annual meeting of gunsmiths in January 1965. Sales would be handled as part orders through Arms Service and not catalogued. Management approved the proposal requesting Operations Committee confirmation.

The economics based on 700 per year sales are shown in Table 4 attached.
