MODEL 660 BOLT ACTION RIFLE (REPLACEMENT FOR THE MODEL 600)

The program is to produce approximately three hundred (300) 308 caliber rifles. Assembly should be started in April and pilot testing completed in May. Tooling should be available to meet this schedule.

Marketing has requested rifles be shipped for field evaluation in June.

Attached as Exhibit 2 are costs and earnings as estimated in the project, revision of the basic figures for the current process and estimated effect resulting from general cost increases for 1967 and 1968.

The present program is to drop the Model 600 in December 1967 to be replaced by the Model 660 in 1968.

Rifle with Manhlicher Stock

The estimated factory cost for the Model 700 BDL and 660 Bolt Action Rifles with Mannlicher Stocks is attached as Exhibit 3. The special features of each rifle are also listed. The estimated expenditures are on the basis that only one or the other rifle would be produced.

Due to the number of center fire bolt action rifles now being offered by Remington, Marketing recommended that the offering of rifles with Mannlicher Stock be deferred.

R & D is investigating the practicability of offering a Mannlicher Stock in the custom gun line.
