TRAPS

MODEL 100T AND 200S TRAPS

Methods & Standards is developing product cost estimates for the 200S and 100T Traps. When the figures are completed, which should be in November, the information will be furnished Marketing.

New Snubber Assemblies (brake) were expected the end of August. The vendor's plant which supplies the metallic lining is on strike. When the strike is settled, a new date for assemblies can be established.

Marketing and R & D plans to submit a program to update traps in the field at the October meeting. A summary of the performance of recently produced traps and a proposed program for servicing of all traps in the field is to be prepared.

EXPERT AND BLUE ROCK TRAPS

Samples of the Expert Trap painted yellow and the Blue Rock in blue with adjusting screws and operating surfaces zinc plated were shown to the Committee. The appearance is improved. No significant increase in product cost is indicated. An improved package for these traps is also being proposed. The die cost for the packaging is estimated at \$100 and without any significant change to the unit price.

Committee Action:

The Committee approved the proposed program for the Expert and Blue Rock Traps.

TOURNAMENT TRAPS

R & D is continuing the development of a hand loading autoangling pneumatic trap. Target breakage is still being experienced. A new barrel is being made which will handle both the new Remington and Western targets.
