The Model Shop has been able to supply 28 and 410 gauge Carriers with the lance which provides a retainer for the Carrier Latch to meet all production requirements.

Production reported that twenty (20) Model 870 Matched Pairs have been produced to date. Marketing will control the invoice shipment of Matched Pairs. Special orders should be completed before shipments are made to customers. A production case with Matched Pair Model 870, 28 and 410 gauge guns was shown to the Committee

The Operations Committee was requested to approve invoice shipment of the Model 1100, 410 gauge 3" chamber field gun. Approval to ship the Model 1100, 410 gauge 24" chamber skeet gun when R & D confirmation tests have been satisfactorily completed was also requested. 83
