are to submit a project and request General Management approval to release to production the latter part of 1970. Expenditures would start in the first quarter of 1971.

MODEL 1100 TRAP SHOTGUN

R & D reported that estimated cost to supply Marketing 12 gauge Trap guns with the power regulator control would be approximately seventeen hundred dollars (\$1700) for the ten (10) sample guns. To provide seventy-five (75) would cost approximately twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000). Changes to the Barrel and Fore End are required. 83

The addition of the power regulator control to Trap Barrels would increase the factory cost \$3.04 each. An expenditure of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) would be required. Operations charges would be twenty thousand seven hundred dollars (\$20,700) and construction ninety-three hundred dollars (\$9300). It is estimated that production could start six (6) months after funds were authorized.

R & D reported that information on the power regulator control has been furnished for a patent application.

Committee Action:

Marketing is to determine the number of guns required to field test the proposed power regulator control. When the quantity is determined, orders are to be issued by Marketing for the guns. R & D will furnish Marketing with a delivery schedule.
