Marketing discussed the need for introducing this gun in 1973. The over and under type shotgun is growing in popularity both in the United States and internationally. Remington entrance into this market with a premium quality over and under shotgun would permit the company to participate in this growing market and would also add prestige to the product line.

Marketing indicated that they could give an accurate field test report to the October Operations Committee if they received the prototype guns September 1.

There was discussion regarding the new building proposed in this project and the total facilities study being made for Ilion. If new building space is to be provided for The 3200 Shotgun, it is necessary to start construction this year. Foundations should be completed in October. It is expected that the facilities study will be finished in time to start construction if the new building is required. 83

Project AD 3200-4 is to be reviewed and up-dated to be certain that it is ready for submission in line with the schedule.

Committee Action:

The Operations Committee decided that tool design should be started now for The 3200 Shotgun. The Committee directed that funds be requested to cover this work through July 1971. No funds are to be requested now for capital investment.
