solved the "fail to eject" problem. A 1000 round sample of shells produced to SAAMI maximum length or less (3.010") still caused "Extractor stems shell" in the test jacks. Changing timing of the gun by moving the Carrier Dog notch in the Slide will either increase "Extractor stems shell" or cause "fail to eject." R & D and Production are continuing work on the problem.

Committee Action:

Production of Model 1100, 410 gauge 3" chamber guns is not to resume until this problem is solved.

LAW ENFORCEMENT GUN STOCK

Marketing presented preliminary information on a proposal for Remington to market a law enforcement gun Stock. This is a metal folding Stock which has been developed by Belmore-Johnson Tool Company. A prototype, attached to a Model 870 Police Gun, was shown.

It is proposed to offer this first as an accessory for the approximately 50,000 Model 870 Police Guns now in the field. It is estimated that this would produce a total sales of 20,000 Stocks. Later, the Stock would be offered as an accessory available with the Model 870 Police Gun. Also the Stock can be adapted to the Ithaca Model 37 gun. The Belmore-Johnson Tool Company would manufacture and package the Stock.

With a suggested selling price of \$27.50, Remington would break even after a total of 4,000 Stocks were sold. It is estimated that \$100,000 annual sales could be achieved.

This Stock will not fit a standard gun lock as used in police cars. However, with the present trend to carry guns into and out of the cars rather than leave in locks, this is not expected to be a problem.
