SHOTGUNS - contd.

MODEL 1100, 410 GAUGE 3" CHAMBER SHOTGUN

R & D reported that revised Carriers will be available November 12 for testing in the Model 1100, 410 gauge 3" chamber shotguns. The effect of the Carrier change, and a change in timing will be evaluated separately and together. It is believed that the gun can be made to handle the longest commercially loaded 3" shells.

LAW ENFORCEMENT GUN STOCK (Introduction 1971)

Production reported that a purchase order has been placed with Bellmore-Johnson Tool Company for the first 5000 Law Enforcement Gun Stocks. Delivery of 50 production Stocks is scheduled to be completed in January, 1972.

Marketing reported that the policy of selling this Stock to recognized law enforcement and military agencies only has been announced to the trade. The details of this policy and the mechanics of control at Ilion are attached as Exhibit 3

RIFLES

MODEL 742-X RIFLE AUTOLOADING CENTER FIRE (Introduction 1975)

R & D reported historical information on autoloading center fire rifle development at Remington (Exhibit 4), and the program of all new sun introductions planned through 1979. These details are attached as Exhibits 5, 6 and 7. Exhibit 5 shows a total expected capital and operational expenditures required to bring the proposed new family of center fire rifles and shotguns into the line. The Research estimates are based upon rather limited design data available at this point. Total expenditures figure of \$24,000,000 was computed by using a factor of 8 times the estimated development cost as indicated by the experience of other major gun development projects.
