

BENCH REST BULLETS

R & D reported that 100,000 bullets were delivered to the Bridgeport warehouse in October. Efforts are now directed at improving production through minor revisions to hoppers and feed systems. The present goal of 10,000 per day should be attained by December 15. It is planned also to deliver the second 100,000 to the warehouse by this time.

TRAPSELECTRIC TOURNAMENT TRAP

R & D reported that quotations have been received on parts for the autoloading magazine system. Factory costs for Remington to produce this from purchased components are attached as Exhibit 8. Two additional companies have been requested to quote on building the trap and autoloading magazine.

Present R & D efforts are concentrated on the skeet trap design. The design details should be completed and costs available about January 1.

Estimating of factory cost for the skeet traps is to be expedited. Marketing was requested to provide retail and net selling prices so that economics can be completed. It is important to have these economics for the December meeting.

SWEDISH TRAPS

Marketing reported that a Remington representative will visit the Swedish manufacturer the week of November 8 to obtain more information on the new trap.

The meeting adjourned at 2:07 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled to be at Ilion on Tuesday, December 14, 1971, at 11:00 a.m.
