SHOTGUNS - contd.MODEL 870 "ALL AMERICAN" 12 GAUGE TRAP GUN
(Introduction 1972)

Production reported that Model 870 "All American" components are delivered as requested to R & D for N/C engraving and checkering. Sample Receivers have been polished after engraving.

R & D reported that by April 10, 100 sets of components would be engraved for the "All American" shotgun. On that date, the N/C engraving machine move to Ilion will start and will be completed April 24. Engraving patterns for the Model 541-S Sporter rifle have been proven.

A basic program error still exists in the N/C checkering for the "All American." When this error is found, production can start. It is planned to complete 100 Stocks and Fore-ends before moving the machine to Ilion.

Marketing reported the following status:

MODEL 870 AND 1100, 12 GAUGE 34" TRAP BARRELS
(Introduction 1972)

Production reported that Model 870 and 1100, 12 gauge 34" Trap Barrels are in production. 1029 Model 1100 and 264 Model 870 Barrels have been shipped to March 13, 1972, with additional shipment scheduled for the week of March 20, 1972.

Marketing reported that 5000 orders have been received for 34" Barrels. It is planned to introduce the Model 1100 Duck - Goose version of the 34" Barrel in June, 1972.
