MODEL 870 "ALL AMERICAN" 12 GAUGE TRAP GUN - contd.

Marketing reported that the N/C machine cut checkering is better than hand cut checkering. The medallion is being accepted. Another six months will be required to determine acceptance of the gun. All of the current orders will be filled this year.

Committee Action:

The Operations Committee approved dropping reporting on the Model 870 "All American" shotgun.

MODEL 870 AND 1100, 12 GAUGE 34" "DUCK-GOOSE" BARRELS (Introduction 1973)

Production of the "Duck-Goose"Barrels will start in Decem with 500 to be available January 1, 1973.

MODEL 3200 SHOTGUN (Introduction 1973)

Production reported that hard opening of the Model 3200 shotgun made it necessary to add a Top Lock Stop to the gun. Guns previously assembled were torn down and reassembled with the Stop. New production includes the Stop. Guns are now being completed ready to warehouse so that design conformation testing can start the week of November 20.

Following the pilot lot of guns, 100 are scheduled to be produced it November and 200 in December.

The revised trap Stock and Vent Rib are in trial and pilot operations. Production of trap guns is scheduled to start in February, 1973.

Delivery of the N/C engraving machine for the 1 of 1000 trap guns has been delayed until the week of December 11. 83
