SHOTGUNS - contd.

MODEL 3200 COMPETITION SKEET AND TRAP SHOTGUNS (Introduction 1976)

Marketing reported that they, R & D and Production are working on alternative product specifications. The originally proposed specifications are not adequate.

Production reported that release of design is needed March 1 to meet the scheduled October warehouse (for original gun specifications). "B" Grade wood is available but not "C" Grade in the required volume.

R & D reported that two new prototype guns with revised specifications will be taken to Bridgeport today for review next week.

Marketing reported that 60% of Model 3200 gun allocations have been ordered. Browning has priced themselves out of the market except for the Citori model.

MODEL 3200, 20, 28 AND 410 GAUGE SAFET BARREL (Introduction June, 1976)

R & D reported that nine Barrel Sets, three each in 20, 28 and 410 gauge, are being fabricated in the Model Shop. (A Barrel Set is one upper and one lower Barrel Assembly, both in the same gauge.) Three 12 gauge skeet guns will be fitted with 20, 28 and 410 gauge Barrel Sets and will be ready for Research testing about April 1 and Marketing testing about June 1.

Production deported that the revised project should be ready

MODEL 3200 SINGLE BARREL TRAP SHOTGUN (Introduction 1977)

R & D reported there has been no design activity on this gun in the last month. Work will resume in March,
