7mm EXPRESS REMINGTON RECALL

Of 261,000 rounds involved in the recall, 105,000 (including 3,400 fired cases) have been returned, representing about 40%. Ammunition is still being received at a rate of about 1,000 rounds a week. Advertising of the recall notice is to be completed in March. In addition to the paid advertising, writers have publicized the recall.

Ballistic tests on returned ammunition confirmed that average pressures exceeded both Remington manufacturing and SAAMI limits. Bridge thickness measurements showed that some of the product in each code was below specifications.

M/3200 RECALL

Of 305 guns involved in the recall, 145 (44%) have been returned. Guns are still being received, but at a dwindling rate. Additional letters will be sent to customers on this matter.

PRODUCT SAFETY WARNINGS

The special task force appointed to consider this subject has established objectives for their work. They have agreed on some recommendations, and will report final results later. This item will remain on the Subcommittee agenda.
