7mm Express Recall

Of the 261,000 rounds involved in the recall, 124,330 (including 3,554 fired cases) were received as of 4/22/81. The 47.6% returned was judged to be better than usual. Due to this success, advertising procedures used for this recall will be reviewed at the next meeting for information.

270 Win. Product Problem

The powder vendor has assured Remington that procedures now have been instituted to better insure against mixed powder problems in the future. Although ballistic pressures of some returned rounds exceed SAAMI maximum recommendations, such pressures do not begin to approach proof pressure range. It was, therefore, decided not to recommend the recall of this 270 Win. ammunition because there is no significant safety hazard.
