Per our telephone conversation, here are the guns that you requested. My father's gun serial# 19191 and my gun serial# 64059 are Remington Model # 600's.

Both guns were sent to Remington Arms Company for repair of defective safeties in the spring of 1988.

While Moose Hunting in October 1988, in the state of Maine, my girlfriend in the process of clearing her rifle that was serial# 64059, pushed the safety off with her thumb, and her hand was closed in a fist. The rifle discharged into the ground at the same time that the safety was moved forward.

This the identical experience as happened to my father last year, resulting in damage to a near by truck. His weapon was model # 19191.

We feel that the safety is still defective and that we cannot trust these weapons. We appreciate you researching into this matter, and notifying me as to the results. Also I would like to know what Remington Arms intends to do to resolve this matter
