



New Remington® M597TM Series Brings Advanced Design To Autoloading Rimfire Rifles

In a major development for 1997, Remington has announced a completely new and innovative design autoloading rimfire rifles – the Model 597TM. Remington believes this is the most significant advance in utoloading rimfire rifles since the introduction of the revolutionary Remington Nylon 66 in 1959. This new amily of rifles is intended for those outdoorsmen who view rimfire shooting as a serious activity. It ombines quality of construction, versatility, and high-level performance in terms of both reliability and ccuracy.

The new Model 597TM will be available in three versions, offering a choice of carbon or stainless steel particled actions, synthetic or laminated wood stocks, and chambering for either standard .22 long rifle or .22 nagnum ammunition. The differences enable the shooter to choose the version that best matches his favorite ype of shooting:

- The M597TM is chambered for .22 long rifle ammunition and matches a Remington carbon steel barrel with a strong, lightweight, alloy receiver. All metal has a non-reflective, matte black finish. The rifle is housed in a one-piece, dark gray synthetic stock.
- The M597TM LSS (Laminated Stock Stainless) has a satin-finished stainless steel barrel and matching, gray-toned alloy receiver, and is set in a handsome, laminated wood stock of light and dark brown shades. It is also chambered for the .22 long rifle cartridge.
- The M597TM MAGNUM, with a carbon steel barrel, alloy receiver and black synthetic stock, combines a return by Remington to both rimfire magnum rifles and rimfire magnum ammunition, and will be chambered for the .22 Win. Mag. rimfire cartridge.

Common stock dimensions of all three M597TM rifles feature generously-sized pistol grips for firm, "big gun" handling. Beaver-style fore-ends are comfortably rounded with finger grooves for hand-filling control. The top of the receiver blends into the pistol grip in a smooth line, creating a sleek-looking rimfire autoloader that points like a shotgun, but aims like a rifle.

All three versions of the new M597TM rimfire autoloader incorporate a number of advanced design features. A unique bolt guidance system of twin steel rails provides extremely smooth bolt travel and long-wearing functional reliability, giving these autoloaders strength and stability normally found only in bolt actions. The 20-inch barrels are free-floated to deliver consistent accuracy with all types of rimfire ammunition. A completely new trigger design creates crisp let-off for autoloading rifles. Staggered clip magazines with a quick drop-out release assure reliable feeding and fast reloading.

Bolts on the two .22 long rifle versions are nickel plated steel. However, the magnum-version bolt is constructed of a special alloy steel of greater weight to provide controlled, uniform function with magnum ammunition. Receivers of all three rifles are grooved for standard tip-off mounts. In addition, they are drilled and tapped for special, Weaver-type bases available from Remington. Easily adjustable open sights are also standard.

New Remington Model 597TM autoloading rimfire rifles will be available at suggested retail prices of \$159.00 for the standard version, \$265.00 for the M597TM LSS, and \$292.00 for the M597TM MAGNUM.

No. 1 Rolling Block Creedmoor-Style Rifle Re-Introduced by Remington®

In 1997, in answer to frequent requests from American shooters, Remington is bringing back the Remington No. 1 Rolling Block Mid-Range Rifle.

This is not a replica, but a reintroduction of the original design, produced by today's manufacturing methods. Among the several Creedmoor-style models to choose from, Remington has brought back the one that is most compatible with actual use today – the No. 1 Rolling Block Creedmoor Mid-Range sporting rifle that was produced from 1875 to 1890.

It will have a 30-inch, half-octagon, half-round tapered barrel chambered for the .45-70 Government round, with 1-in-18" twist, six-groove rifling for exceptional accuracy with black powder cartridges and cast lead bullets.

Continuing both the design and appearance of the 1875 mid-range rolling block, this one will have a case-colored receiver extending through the integral trigger guard at the bottom. The steel fore-end tip is also case colored. The trigger and the rolling block breech bolt and hammer are niter-blued and the barrel is finished with standard bluing. All barrel, receiver and metalwork markings duplicate those of original production.

Sights include a rear, tang-mounted vernier sight and a front globe sight with four, interchangeable inserts and traditional spirit level. A single, set trigger completes the action. The original stock has been produced in fancy American walnut with extensive cut checkering on both the fore-end and pistol grip. And the butt stock has a smooth-surface, steel butt plate.

Each Mid-Range Rolling Block rifle is matched with a high quality, hard case with interior fitted compartments of green billiard felt and outside appointments of duck canvas with genuine leather end trim. The case is secured by key locks.

The rifle and case combination will be available at a suggested retail price of \$2,799.00.



Remington Arms Company, Inc., has introduced a new lightweight European-styled addition to its family of autoloading shotguns. The Remington Model 11-96TM Euro Lightweight is based on the famous Model 11-87TM action, known for reliable functioning with light and heavy loads.
