SUBJECT:

MODEL 720 - IMPROVEMENT IN STOCK FINISH

We have heard complaints that our Model 720 stock finish does not compare favorably with competition. A sample gun with improved finish was submitted to the Technical Planning Committee February 12. That Committee recommended a proposel for Products Committee consideration and approval.

The improved finish was accomplished by the addition of a hand sanding operation and an additional coat of lacquer. The additional commercial cost is \$.242 per gun; based on normal burden and normal forecast, economics are as follows:
