Attached are certain comments regarding the Model 4OX rifle, resulting from test firing by Dan Carroll, Fred Kuhn and Roy Kuhn. At the first opportunity we would like to discuss these suggestions to see where we go from here.

In the meantime, we neither recommend or oppose any of these comments but pass them along to you at this stage for such consideration as you may find necessary.

Your recent letter refers to questions about new design trigger guard and floor plate for the Model 4OX. While we prefer the new design, it was our intent that this new target rifle sell for less than \$100.00, without sights. If it is necessary to accept the regular 721 guard and floor plate to meet the price requirements, so be it. The fire control housing may be something else again. The trigger on a target rifle must be right. If extra effort is required here, we should do so to be sure of our trigger, else we will not have a target rifle.
