→ MODELS 721 & 722 - SPORTER STOCKS & SHORTENED BARREL
(OPERATIONS COMMITTEE MINUTES NO. 1, 1960)

The minutes requested a prototype of the Models 721 and 722 be delivered to Bridgeport. The model gun has been furnished.

During the past several years, the Models 721 and 722 have been improved by changing to the new sight line and common Stock. *improved sight*

When the change to the Sporter Stock and shorter Barrel was proposed, the following was considered the most desirable program.

1. Models 721 & 722 plain Stock with Monte Carlo cheek piece without checkering or Grip Cap (except the Model 721, 300 H&H Magnum would have Recoil Pad).
2. Model 725 shorter Stock. (Same length as sample)
3. Models 721, 722, & 725 Barrels would be of the same outside contour (present 30-06 Barrel) and would vary only by caliber. All Barrels would be 20" long except, possibly the 300 H&H Magnum and 222 - these would be 22".

The economics developed October 29, 1959 for the Models 721 and 722 indicate the following: (Copy of which you received.)

As indicated, there is no anticipated increase in sales due to the improvement. Also, as pointed out, there was no increase in selling price proposed. The spread between the Models 721, 722, and 725 is less if this change is to be made.
