I happened to pick up a copy of "The American Rifleman" and noticed your page of advertisement on the Remington 700 and the article on "How to take the luck out of the long shot."

First I would like to state that I had the oppturnity to be among the first group of Marine Corps Snipers in Viet-Nam in 1966 whe exporimented and tested different weapons to develop one standard sniper rifle.

Our tests included the M-1, M-14, Winchester Medel 70, and the Remington 700. By far the Remington 700 (With a Redfield accurance 3 to 9 variable scope) proved superior to any other weapon tested.

My personal experiences with the Remington 700 was an enemy KIA at 1100 meters and a WIA at 1600 meters both confirmed and plotted by grid coordinates.

I would like to montion that the snipers best position for long range shooting was the prone position. A sandbag, jacket, etc, anything placed undernwath the weapon that would aid in the steadiness of our aim.

I wish to complement and thank your company for a very fine weapon. I am looking forward to the purchase of my next Remington 700. Incleased is a photo and news clipping from The Stars and Stripes.
