XP-100 PISTOL

A meeting was held with Process Engineering, Accounting and Arms Service concerning the use of the Trigger Balance in the XP-100 Pistol. Our recommendations were

- 1. That customers who purchased barreled actions be notified the Trigger Balance, Trigger Balance Spring and Trigger Balance Pin are an integral part of the Trigger Mechanism and should be used when stocking this action.
- 2. That Trigger Balance, Trigger Balance Spring and Trigger Balance @in be made available to these customers.
- That all customers be notified via advertisement or other practical means that the Trigger Balance, Trigger Balance Spring and Trigger Balance Pin should not be removed from the Pistol.

The people attending this meeting agreed that this could be handled by their respective departments.

There are records in Accounting that can be used which go back to the introduction of this model.

The factory cost of these parts is 58 cents and I would estimate that there were less than 1000 barreled actions sold.

The Product Safety Committee has agreed that "The Silhouette" should be notified concerning the function of the Trigger Balance in the XP-100 Pistol. Item No. 3 recommendation above would cover all owners of the Pistol.

If all parties agree with this letter, the recommendation can be implemented.
