SUBJECT: XP-100 7MM BR PISTOLS - I.H.M.S.A. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The two (2) XP-100 pistols, in 7mm BR Rem. caliber, that were displayed at the I.H.M.S.A. Championship matches held in Phoenix, Arizona, October 4-7, 1979, were very enthusiastically received by the shooters and visitors present at the match.

The following comments and points should be noted:

The vast majority stated that they preferred the gun be marketed without sights, with only the front sight ramp supplied, as they desired to select their own sights.

Most felt that an additional sight ramp screw hole, near the muzzle should be provided to allow more flexibility in sight selection and mounting.

Many stated that, since the pistols will be chambered for a "wildcat" cartridge, Remington should make provision to supply completely formed component cases and loading data.

Several complaints were heard regarding the weakness and breakage of the present rear receiver screw escutcheon. It was hoped that improvements would be made in this area.

Several shooters requested that Remington change the rear sight on the standard XP-100 (221 Fireball) to one incorporating a positive click adjustment. This would allow easier sight changes and, the gun would still meet Production Class criteria.

In general, all who viewed the display guns were elated that Remington had decided to offer a larger caliber XP-100, Unlimited Class, pistol for the metallic silhouette shooter and, the approximate retail price of \$300.00 appeared very acceptable.

As requested, E.D. Bedore retained the two (2) display guns and will deliver them to the October 21-24 sales meeting.
