SUBJECT: MODEL 700 ADL RESTYLE FOR 1983

At the Operations Committee Meeting on Thursday, April 15, 1982, Ed Barrett indicated that plans to introduce the Sporter in 1983 have been canceled. The Model Seven LWT is a major new product and Ed does not want to compromise that product by adding to Productions burden another new model (i.e., the Sporter). Therefore, the strategy for 1983 is to limit our scope to restyling the ADL. Furthermore, that work must be restricted to improvements which can be implemented easily enough to permit warehousing the ADL in September - October without interfering with the carbine.

Based on the above guidelines from Ed Barrett, Production indicates that the following features can be implemented on a restyled ADL:

- Walnut stock - No fore-end tip
- Cut checkering
 - 18 lines/inch
 - Grip and fore-end (side panels only)
- Stock as is
 - no change in former
 - can not slim down

- Grip Cap — BDL (with inserts for BDL?)
 - Can not do M/4 with inserts without slimming stock
- No white line spacers
- Sling swivel studs
- No rubber butt pad
- Medium gloss wood finish
- Floor plate
- Scope mounts — Probably can do by September, but would be risky
- Iron sights — Add only if scope mounts not added
- Standard ADL follower — Can not add "no bind"
- Calibers; 22-250, .243, .270, 30-06, 7mm Mag.
