Dear John,

Per our conversation of 2-3-83, the objectives are as follows;

- A. The samples produced thus far have passed our inspection requirements except for the tool marks found on the long leg sear safety cam surface and .001 - .002 oversize (1.080-1.083 dim.) between legs.
- Connecticut Spring will produce and screen approximately 800 pieces with these conditions corrected. Estimated delivery to Remington is 2-10-83 via Purolator.
 - The balance of material on hand has been rejected and replacement due 5 to 6 weeks.
- B. During the interim for the correct material, Connecticut Spring will provide round wire to a local rolling mill to produce square stock to thickness. The exception is that it estimated that an edge break of .010 - .015 will result.
- Connecticut Spring is authorized to produce only 2,000 pieces for Engineering approval. Delivery expected 3 to 4 weeks.
 - If these parts meet drawing specification, except for the edge break, then we are committed for acceptance as agreed.

As you are well aware, this project has extended far beyond the normal development time for a part such as this. Because of our urgent need for trigger connectors at this time, I am confident that Connecticut Spring will proceed in the most expeditious manner to complete this project.


