Thank you for your inquiry. We have a Safety Modification Program on certain model bolt action rifles. This is a voluntary program, it is not a recall. This is designed to remind people of the existence of the bolt-lock feature and to offer customers the opportunity to modernize their products. You will need to reinstall the factory trigger before we can do the modification. We will only do the modification if we can test the firearm after the modification has been done and we are unable to test our firearm with another manufacturer's trigger in it due to liability reasons. Once we have completed the modification you can reinstall the factory trigger.
