Dear Mr. Russell, Thank you for your inquiries. The bolt lock mechanism itself cannot make the firearm discharge. Users of the firearms need to be particularly cautious when unloading, however, because the safety must be in the off or fire position to raise the bolt and begin the unloading process. Remington is aware of reports that rifles with this Teature when initiating the unloading process have accidentally discharged, and whenever a gun fires accidentally, there is a risk of property damage, serious injury or death. This program is for owners of older bolt-action firearms who want to be able to unload their guas with the safety in the "safe" or "on safe" position.

As far as your Model 700, we suggest that you send your firearm to our Ilion, NY facility.

For U.S. repairs, please follow these guidelines:

1. Record the serial number of your firearm before sending it to us.

2. Pack your firearm for safety and to prevent further damage in shipping and handling. Preferably, ship in a firearm box, not a hardcase.

3. Remove all accessories from your firearm to prevent loss or damage. This would include scope, slings, or extra choke tubes.

4. Enclose a letter with the firearn detailing the model name or number of your firearm and serial number along with a full description of the problem. Be sure to include your full mame and address (P.O. Box and Street Address), including zip code, daytime telephone number, and e-mail address.

5. Ship your firearm by either United Parcel Service (UPS) or Parcel Post (US Post Office). Remington is not responsible for damage or loss during shipment, so you may elect to purchase insurance from your carrier.


