Your rifle was originally installed with a bolt-lock, which means you have to put the safety switch on fire before you can open the bolt. We are offering a conversion at a special price if you would like your firearm converted, so that you can open the bolt at anytime with the safety on safe.

We recommend sending the rifle to the following Premier Repair Center to inspect the firearm for firing when the safety is taken off. Discontinue use until we can inspect the firearm.
