Thank you for your inquiry. Your Model 700 PSS was manufactured in 1993 at our firearms plant in Ilion New York. Only those Model 700 or 40-x rifles made before March 1982 were manufactured with a bolt-lock mechanism. Model 700 or 40-x rifles made after March 1982 do not have a bolt-lock mechanism and may be loaded and unloaded with the safety in the "5" or "on Safe" position. Consequently, post-1982 Model 700 or 40-x rifles are not subject to this bolt-lock Safety Modification Program. We hope that this information is helpful to you.
