Welcome to Remington Country!

The Remington Model 725 was a centerfire rifle. The Model 725 was similar to the Models 721/722 with a Monte Carlo stock, Hinged floorplate and oversized three position safety. This model was introduced in 1958 and was discontinued in 1962. Calibers offered in this model included the .30-06, .280 Rem., .270 Win., .244 Rem., .222 Rem., .243 Win., .375 Win. Mag., .458 Mag. Our records indicate that we manufactured approximately 17,000 of this model.

As with any used firearm, we would strongly recommend you have the firearm serviced and evaluated by a competent gunsmith for function and safety.
