Thank you for visiting Remington Country. According to the information that you provided, your Remington Model 700 was produced in or around 1964. We do not have production totals for specific calibers. The Model 700 was introduced in 1962 and is still in production today. This model is widely recognized as the "most accurate out of the box production rifle" on the market today. We cannot tell you what twist rate you have without knowing the caliber. We would suggest that you review the information found on our homepage in the Safety Center entitled "Bolt Action Safety Message: Safety Modification Program for certain pre-1982 rifles".

In firing line forum a member stated that there were two (2) twist rates 1 in 9 and 1 in 12 and that for one of those I would have a problem with stability with bullets over 100 grains.

I need to know which twist is best for what and what twist do I have? The serial number is 85230.
