In other words, if I chamber a round and utilize teh safety the trigger pull is much more stiff than if I had simply chambered a round without using the safety. I had my local Rem. authorized gunsmith weigh the trigger pull and he said that without the safety the pull is about 4.25 lbs. and with the safety being flipped from safe to fire the pull increases to just over 5 lbs. why would this be? What should I look at as the problem or is this standard behavior? Any help would be greatly appreciated. Tom Morreale
