hand, we cannot determine if your rifle is safe to use or not. This is
something that a Remington Authorized Repair Center or qualified gunsmith
can determine when looking at your firearm. The bolt lock mechanism
itself cannot make the firearm discharge. Users of the firearms need to
be particularly cautious when unloading, however, because the safety must
be in the off or fire position to raise the bolt and begin the unloading
process.
