Dear Blake,

Welcome to Remington Country!

There's not an official terminology listing to check with, but we believe the listing refers to the "Integrated Security System", more commonly known as the ISS. This system adds a second "safety wall" to the firearm by having a second lock that will prevent the firearm's use. It will lock the bolt into place; the bolt cannot be moved unless the ISS lock is "turned off" by utilizing an ISS key.

We recommend describing the system above to the owner of the firearm. Should the owner state that it is not the ISS key, we recommend asking for the serial number of the firearm and a general description of the "bolt lock".

Should you purchase the firearm and it is a used firearm purchase:

As with any used firearm, we would strongly recommend you have the firearm serviced and evaluated by a competent gunsmith for function and safety. We feel it is imperative you know the exact condition of your firearm prior to shooting. Please also read our "Guide to Buying a Used Gun" found through the link below:
