THE FACTORY MAKES A SMALL MODIFICATION TO THE STOCK ON THESE FIREARMS WHEN THE SAFETY MODIFICATION IS PERFORMED. IF IT COMES IN WITHOUT THE STOCK THEY WILL NOT MAKE THE MODIFICATION UNTIL THEY SEND IN THE REMAINING PORTION OF THE FIREARM. THEY DON'T HAVE TO HAVE THE MODEL 700 STOCKS BUT THEY DO PREFER THAT THEY SEND THEM IN ALSO.
