He asked me to show him the safty, and how the gun loads. While chambering a round the gun fired for no apparent reason. I am right handed and my right hand was still on the bolt. Both of us were shocked. I felt sick thinking of what could have happened. I thank God that no one was hurt.

I have lost all confidence in this model gun, and feel that this model gun has serious safty flaws. This is the only Remington product that I have owned that has had any problem.
